





She's the saucy, gregarious host of HBO's "At the Multiplex with Judy Gold" and is a regular fixture on Comedy Central's "Tough Crowd with Colin Quinn" and "Hollywood Squares." She can often be seen gabbing with the girls on "The View" and reminiscing about the past and counting down the greatest videos and celebrity moments on "VH-1's All Access." Judy's half hour special "Comedy Central Presents: Judy Gold" continues to receive high ratings as does Comedy Central's recent special, "Tough Crowd Stands Up." And if you think Judy has forgotten her roots... think again. She was recently featured on the BBC and Comedy Central special, "The Heroes of Jewish Comedy," and her one-person show about Jewish mothers, G-d Doesn't Pay Rent Here, debuted to rave reviews at The Empty Space Theatre in Seattle. Judy also co-starred in the Off-Broadway production of The Vagina Monologues. On the small screen, Judy has appeared on a plethora of shows including "Sex & The City," "The Tonight Show with Jay Leno," "Law & Order," "Law & Order: S.V.U.," "The Drew Carey Show," and "As The World Turns," just to name a few. She also co-starred with Glenn Close in the CBS movie of the week, The Ballad of Lucy Whipple. She is surely no stranger to awards, either. Judy won 2 Emmy Awards for writing and producing "The Rosie O'Donnell Show", and she won a Cable Ace award for her own HBO half hour special. She was nominated twice for The American Comedy Award's funniest female stand-up. Judy lives in New York City with her family, and tours theatres and comedy clubs around the country.



EDITH OLIVER AWARD FOR SUSTAINED EXCELLENCE

The Edith Oliver Award for Sustained Excellence was established to honor the individual who best embodies the high level of artistic achievement as defined by Ms. Oliver's criticisms for *The New Yorker* during her more than a quarter of a century as drama critic.



BETTY CORWIN

Betty Corwin, founder and former director of the Theatre on Film and Tape Archive (TOFT), proposed the idea of preserving visual records of live theatre performances to The New York Public Library for the Performing Arts at Lincoln Center in 1969. Her background as production assistant and script reader for theatrical producers prepared her to create the Archive, the foremost collection of videotapes of live theatre performances in the world.

Ms Corwin has spoken about TOFT to groups across the country, in London and in Warsaw. Articles about her and about TOFT have appeared in several publications; she has appeared on a number of radio and television programs and, with TOFT a role model for similar archives, has served as a consultant to various organizations.

She is the recipient of an Outer Critics Special Award (1996), a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Broadway Theatre Institute (1996), a Certificate of Appreciation from the City of New York (1993), an Obie Award (1993), awards from the Drama Desk (1988), Women in Communications (1984), the Villager (1982) and a Westport Connecticut Arts Award for Lifetime Achievement (2001).

Ms Corwin has been a juror for the Pulitzer Prize for Drama, is a member of the Tony Awards Nominating Committee, a judge for the Clarence Derwent Award, the St. Clair Bayfield Award, The Joseph A Callaway Award, the Richard Seff Award, is on the advisory board of Theatre Talk Productions, and is on the Artistic Advisory Council to the Westport Country Playhouse. Articles by Ms Corwin have been published in *Performing Arts Resources, Variety* and *League Line*.

At present Ms Corwin is the Director of Special Projects for TOFT for which she coordinated a joint project between the Library and the American Theatre Wing, videotaping a series of "How to" interviews with 32 notable theatre personalities describing the preparation for their careers and the roles they play in creating a theatrical production. Currently she is Co-producer of the League of Professional Theatre Women's WOMEN IN THEATRE television series, dialogues with notable women in American theatre broadcast on CUNY-TV.

ATLANTIC THEATER COMPANY (Neil Pepe, Artistic Director, Andrew D. Hamingson, Managing Director) is the award-winning Off-Broadway theater that produces great plays simply and truthfully utilizing an artistic ensemble. Founded in 1985 by David Mamet and William H. Macy, Atlantic believes that the story of a play and the intent of its playwright are at the core of the creative process. The plays in the Atlantic repertory, from both new and established playwrights, are boldly interpreted by today's finest theater artists and resonate with contemporary audiences.

Since its inception twenty years ago, Atlantic has produced more than one hundred plays, including last season's World Premiere of David Mamet's *Romance*, and this season's New York Premiere of new writer Rolin Jones' *The Intelligent Design of Jenny Chow*, Martin McDonagh's *The Lieutenant of Inishmore*, his previous Tony Award-winning production of The Beauty Queen of Leenane, Woody Allen's A Second Hand Memory and Writer's Block, the revival of David Mamet's American Buffalo, Dangerous Corner by J.B. Priestley, The Cider House Rules, adapted by Peter Parnell, The Hothouse, and this season's Celebration and The Room by Harold Pinter, Mojo by Jez Butterworth, the New York premieres of Howard Korder's Boys' Life and The Lights at Lincoln Center Theater, and Tina Howe's adaptation of Ionesco's The Bald Soprano and The Lesson. During its history, Atlantic has garnered four Tony Awards, two Lucille Lortel Awards, seven Obie Awards, and an Outer Critics Circle Award.

Atlantic also operates the ATLANTIC ACTING SCHOOL. The school offers an undergraduate program in conjunction with New York University's Tisch School of the Arts, as well as a two year professional acting conservatory and a six-week intensive workshop every summer. The ATLANTIC FOR KIDS program produces new works, and adaptations of children's theater classics on the Company's mainstage serving kindergarten and middle schools and its STUDENTS AND EDUCATORS SERIES provides high school students with in-classroom instruction and attendance of mainstage shows. Atlantic currently serves 3,000 students in 17 New York City Public schools.











PLAYWRIGHTS' SIDEWALK INDUCTEE



John Patrick Shanley

John Patrick Shanley has come a long way. He started in The Bronx and now lives in Brooklyn. His plays include *Defiance, Danny and the Deep Blue Sea, Savage in Limbo, the dreamer examines his pillow, Beggars in the House of Plenty, Welcome to the Moon, Four Dogs and a Bone, Italian American Reconciliation, Missing/Kissing, The Big Funk, Where's My Money, Dirty Story and Sailor's Song*. His play, *Doubt,* is currently running on Broadway and was awarded the 2005 Pulitzer Prize for Drama and the 2005 Tony Award for Best Play. In the arena of film, Mr. Shanley has had four spec screenplays produced: *Five Corners, Moonstruck, The January Man* and *Joe Versus the Volcano. Five Corners* won the Special Jury Prize for its screenplay at the Barcelona Theatre Festival. For *Moonstruck,* Shanley received both the Academy Award and the Writers Guild of America Award for Best Original Screenplay. He also did the film adaptations of both *Alive* and *Congo*. Mr. Shanley directs in both theatre and film, but otherwise seems completely clueless.
