


CLASSICAL THEATRE OF HARLEM

Since being founded in 1999 by Christopher McElroen and Alfred Preisser, the Classical Theatre of Harlem (CTH) has presented thirty productions yielding 12 AUDELCO Awards, 5 Obie Awards, a 2006 Lucille Lortel Award, a 2005 Drama Desk Award and CTH being named "1 of 8 theatres in America to Watch" by the Drama League. Productions have included numerous works by Shakespeare, August Wilson's Ma Rainey's Black Bottom, Euripides, Medea and Trojan Women, a new stage adaptation of Richard Wright's Native Son, Jean Genet's The Blacks: A Clown Show, Derek Walcott's Dream on Monkey Mountain, an extremely successful revival of Melvin Van Peebles' Ain't Supposed To Die A Natural Death, Anton Chekhov's The Cherry Orchard (featuring Earle Hyman), Adrienne Kennedy's Funnyhouse of a Negro (directed by Billie Allen) Samuel Beckett's Waiting for Godot (with Wendell Pierce), King Lear featuring stage and screen veterans André DeShields and Ted Lange, and most recently Peter Weiss' Marat/Sade.

It is CTH's vision to create the next great American theatre company whose value to its community is inherent and essential, a company that is engaged in producing theatre that has the capacity to change lives and truly reflects the diversity of ideas and racial tapestry that is New York City.

As an actor, he has appeared in movies and in his own plays. He's appeared with Sigourney Weaver in their co-authored Das Lusitania Songspiel (Drama Desk nominations for both of them), and with Julie Andrews in the Stephen Sondheim revue Putting It Together at Manhattan Theatre Club. With John Augustine and Sherry Anderson he performed his crackpot cabaret Chris Durang and Dawne (Bistro Award). ACTORS FUND OF AMERICA


The Actors Fund, celebrating 125 years of helping everyone in entertainment, is honored to be recognized by The Lucille Lortel Awards.

Founded in 1882, The Fund serves those in film, theatre, television, music, opera, and dance with a broad spectrum of programs including comprehensive social services, health services, supportive and affordable housing, emergency financial assistance, employment and training services, and skilled nursing and assisted living care.

In the 19th Century the term "Actor" defined anyone and everyone working in the theatrical profession and by 1889 it was reported that the Actors Fund helped "two hundred and forty nine actors and actresses belonging to the dramatic, operatic and variety stage, two minstrels, one 'ballet girl' and seven dancers, seven musicians, four stage managers, five circus performers, three wardrobe keepers, three door keepers, nine stage machinists, twelve agents, four property men, one gas engineer, two dramatic authors, four managers, one captain of supers, three scenic artists, two widows of professionals and two magicians."

Such was the outreach of The Actors Fund then, and so is it now, adapting to emerging needs of everyone who works in performing arts and entertainment. Administered from offices in New York, Los Angeles, and Chicago, last year The Fund served over 8,000 people in 46 states. The Actors Fund is a safety net, providing programs and services for those who are in need, crisis, or transition.
