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

EDITH OLIVER AWARD FOR SUSTAINED EXCELLENCE



THEODORE MANN

Theodore Mann co-founded Circle in the Square Theatre with Jose Quintero in 1951. Their revival in 1952 of Tennessee Williams' Summer and Smoke with Geraldine Page is recognized to be the "birth of Off-Broadway." For more than a half century, Circle has been in the forefront of American theatre with groundbreaking productions that include the highly acclaimed revival of Eugene O'Neill's The Iceman Cometh in 1956, followed that same year with the American premiere of Eugene O'Neill's Long Day's Journey into Night, for which the playwright was awarded posthumously the Pulitzer Prize. These two productions led to a re-evaluation of O'Neill, now recognized to be America's greatest playwright.

Mann has remained a major driving force behind Circle and has produced and/or directed more than 250 productions, including 19 productions of O'Neill. In 1963 Paul Libin became co-producer with Mr. Mann and they have presented classic American and European plays—from Williams and Shaw to Moliere and Greek classics such as Euripides' *Trojan Women*—as well as works by Jules Feiffer, Horton Foote, Truman Capote, Arthur Miller, Athol Fugard, and Terrence McNally. Circle has given America a theatre that is innovative and risk taking. Actors whose careers have been encouraged by the Circle include Al Pacino, James Earl Jones, Vanessa, Lynn and Corin Redgrave, Nathan Lane, Kevin Kline, Annette Bening, Laura Linney, Ruby Dee, Joanne Woodward, Dustin Hoffman, George C. Scott, Colleen Dewhurst, Jason Robards, and many more.

In 1972 Circle in the Square moved from its Greenwich Village origins to its new home on Broadway. Circle productions over the years include those of O'Neill's *Mourning Becomes Electra*, with Colleen Dewhurst and directed by Mann; *Uncle Vanya* with George C. Scott, Nicol Williamson, Julie Christie, Cathleen Nesbitt, and Lillian Gish, directed by Mike Nichols; *The Lady from the Sea* with Vanessa Redgrave in her Broadway debut; *Salome* and *Hughie* with Al Pacino; Shaw's *Candida* with Joanne Woodward; Coward's *Design for Living* with Frank Langella, Raul Julia and Jill Clayburgh; and *Death of a Salesman* with George C. Scott, directed by Mr. Scott. Theodore Mann and Circle productions have received several Tony Awards and nominations.

Theodore Mann continues to actively oversee the Circle and also its celebrated Circle in the Square Theatre School, which he founded in 1963 and includes among its graduates Philip Seymour Hoffman, Felicity Huffman, Benicio Del Toro, Kevin Bacon and Idina Menzel. He also directs plays on other stages as well as opera. Earlier this year he directed the tribute to Luciano Pavarotti at Lincoln Center. The next production at Circle in the Square will be *Glory Days*, a new musical, which opens on May 6.

He was married to the late Patricia Brooks, a leading lyric coloratura at New York City Opera. He has two sons Andrew and Jonathan and five grandchildren Samuel, Clementine, Benjamin Theodore, Jackson, and Dakota.

Theodore Mann's new book, JOURNEYS IN THE NIGHT: Creating a New American Theatre with Circle in the Square, has just been published by Applause Theatre & Cinema Books to enthusiastic reviews.

Primary Stages has significantly contributed to the non-profit theater community by producing 22 seasons and over 90 productions. By fostering an environment where writers are encouraged to explore the scope of their creative vision, Primary Stages has been instrumental in developing the skills of hundreds of young artists as well as helping to create a library of new works for the American theater. Primary Stages has given life to many new plays by such writers as Charles Busch, Constance Congdon, A.R. Gurney, Willy Holtzman, David Ives, Julia Jordan, Gen LeRoy, Romulus Linney, Donald Margulies, Melissa Manchester, Terrence McNally, Conor McPherson, Lanie Robertson, John Patrick Shanley and Mac Wellman. Over the years the company has received considerable critical acclaim including Obie, AUDELCO, Outer Critic Circle, Lucille Lortel, Drama League and Drama Desk awards and nominations. 

HORIZON

Created, written and composed by Rinde Eckert Directed by David Schweizer June - July 2007

RINDE ECKERT, a 2007 Pulitzer Prize finalist for Drama and Obie-winner for And God Created Whales, is renowned as a writer, composer, director and performer whose Opera/New Music Theatre productions have toured extensively. In Horizon, a work for three actors loosely based on the teachings of theologian Reinhold Niebuhr, Eckert plays Reinhart Poole, an unconventional theologian and teacher of ethics at a seminary. Reinhart, who has been pressured to resign by dogmatic powers within his church, works all night on his last lecture. He also talks with his wife, argues with the ghost of his brother, remembers conversations, and indulges his hobby: writing a comic allegory about two ageless masons who've been building the same church foundation for 1,750 years. In story, song, movement, and music Reinhart, his family, and his strange masons inhabit a visually brilliant landscape, a moving and funny horizon.

Heidi Rodewald has spent more than a decade as a performer, arranger, producer and composer for both The Negro Problem and the multi-disciplinary ensemble known as Stew. Credits include *Passing Strange*, Berkeley Repertory Theatrer/The Public Theater (2006/2007); composer, Karen Kandel's *Portraits: Night and Day* (2004); co-writer with Stew of the screenplay *We Can See Today*, Sundance Screenwriters Lab/Directors Lab (2005); wrote and performed with the seminal female punk band Wednesday Week.

Annie Dorsen co-conceived *Passing Strange* and directed it on Broadway, at the Public, at Berkeley Rep, and elsewhere. Current: *Democracy in America* (The Foundry/P.S. 122). Recent: *Antigone Arkhe* (Women's Project), *The Crazy Girl* (NYS&F), *Somewhere Someplace Else* (Clubbed Thumb). Honors: Audelco Award, Sir John Gielgud Fellowship from SSDC, and both the Boris Sagal and Bill Foeller Fellowships from the Williamstown Theatre Festival.
