

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EDITH OLIVER AWARD FOR SUSTAINED EXCELLENCE



IRA WEITZMAN

As the creator and first Director of the Musical Theater Program at Playwrights Horizons and Lincoln Center Theater, and later as Associate Producer of Musical Theater at both institutions, starting in 1978, he developed the original productions of William Finn and James Lapine's Falsettos trilogy, Lynn Ahrens and Stephen Flaherty's Lucky Stiff and Once On This Island, George C. Wolfe's first Off-Broadway show, Paradise!, Stephen Sondheim and James Lapine's Sunday on the Park with George, Into the Woods, and Passion, Sondheim and John Weidman's Assassins, Brian Crawley and Jeanine Tesori's Violet, Kirsten Childs' The Bubbly Black Girl Sheds Her Chameleon Skin, James Valcq and Fred Alley's The Spitfire Grill, Ricky Ian Gordon and Richard Nelson's My Life With Albertine, Michael John LaChiusa's Hello Again, Marie Christine, and Bernarda Alba, the revival of Rodgers and Hammerstein's Carousel, Graciela Daniele, Jim Lewis and Bob Telson's Chronicle of a Death Foretold, Finn and Lapine's A New Brain, Susan Stroman and Weidman's Contact, Ahrens, Flaherty and Terrence McNally's A Man of No Importance, Alfred Uhry and Jason Robert Brown's Parade, Finn's Elegies: A Song Cycle, Burt Shevelove, Nathan Lane and Sondheim's The Frogs, Martha Clarke and Charles Mee's Belle Epoque, Ahrens and Flaherty's Dessa Rose and The Glorious Ones, Adam Guettel and Craig Lucas' The Light in the Piazza, and, within the last year, the Tony Award-winning revival of Rodgers and Hammerstein's South Pacific, Clay by Matt Sax and Eric Rosen which inaugurated LCT3, a new initiative devoted to the work of emerging artists, and Happiness by Stroman, Weidman, Michael Korie and Scott Frankel, currently running in the Newhouse Theater. He produced the acclaimed revival of Moss Hart and Irving Berlin's As Thousands Cheer for Drama Dept. In addition, he was the first Artistic Director of City Center's Encores! and producer of Lincoln Center's American Songbook concert series.

OUTSTANDING BODY OF WORK



The LARK PLAY DEVELOPMENT CENTER was founded in 1994 as a laboratory for unheard voices and new ideas, reaching across cultural boundaries to embrace the diverse perspectives of playwrights from New York City and around the world. We value the theater as a proven forum for individual vision and free expression, and we open our doors to playwrights from all walks of life without respect to age, gender, race, ethnicity, geography, economics, or whether or not they have an agent. We support each artist's creative process through programs that span a continuum from PLAY SCOUTING (which centers on our Open Access Program and on active outreach to artists and communities that may not be viewed as traditional sources for new work) to PLAY INCUBATION (which offers artistic resources, financial support and the opportunity to see work performed) to PLAY ADVANCEMENT (where we work with producers to assure continued life for vital plays). We engage audiences at every step of the process and steward strategic partnerships with a host of theaters, universities, and community-based organizations to advance plays to multiple productions locally and globally. Over the past three years, we've worked with 30 partner institutions to advance 104 Lark-developed plays to 122 venues across the country and the world. Recent projects include: Rajiv Joseph's Bengal Tiger at the Baghdad Zoo (Center Theatre Group), Tracey Scott Wilson's The Good Negro (The Public Theater), Aditi Brennan Kapil's Love Person (Mixed Blood Theatre), Trista Baldwin's Sand (The Women's Project), Sinan Unel's Cry of the Reed (Huntington Theatre), Lloyd Suh's The Children of Vonderly (Ma-Yi Theatre Company), Theresa Rebeck's Mauritius (Manhattan Theatre Club), David Henry Hwang's Yellow Face (The Public Theater), Karen Zacarías' How the Garcia Girls Lost Their Accents (Round House Theatre), Rob Ackerman's Icarus of Ohio (New York University), Carlo D'Amore's No Parole (The Marsh), and Kesav Wable's For Flow (Theater for the New City).
