MAURA TIERNEY

One of the brightest acting talents to emerge in recent years, Emmy nominated actress, Maura Tierney, is perhaps best known for her role on the top rated NBC series "ER" on which she starred for 8 seasons. More recently, Tierney was seen on the CBS Drama, "The Good Wife," as well as the critically acclaimed "Rescue Me" as the newest love interest of Dennis Leary's character and reprised that role for the show's last season. Tierney also starred opposite Rob Morrow on ABC's "The Whole Truth." This spring she makes her Broadway debut starring in Nora Ephron's *Lucky Guy*, alongside Tom Hanks.

Tierney was last seen on the big screen in the comedy *Nature Calls* alongside Johnny Knoxville, Patton Oswalt and Rob Riggle. Tierney has also starred in such films as Universal's *Baby Mama* with Tina Fey and Amy Poehler, New Line Cinema's comedy *Semi-Pro* opposite Will Ferrell and Woody Harrelson, Magnolia Pictures' *Diggers* opposite Paul Rudd and Ken Marino, Twentieth Century Fox's comedy *Welcome to Mooseport* opposite Ray Romano and Gene Hackman, and *Instinct* opposite Sir Anthony Hopkins and Cuba Gooding Jr.

She earned critical praise for her role in *Primary Colors* as well as for her work opposite Jim Carrey in the smash hit *Liar Liar*. Tierney also appeared in the Christopher Nolan directed film *Insomnia* opposite Al Pacino, Hilary Swank and Robin Williams. Additional film credits include *Primal Fear* and *Scotland*, *PA*.

In 2006, she starred in the Off-Broadway production of Neil LaBute's *Some Girl(s)* at the Lucille Lortel Theatre, joining the cast with Eric McCormack, Fran Drescher, Judy Reyes and Brooke Smith. Additionally, she starred in Nicky Silver's *Three Changes* with Dylan McDermott and, most recently, in The Wooster Group's *North Atlantic* with Frances McDormand. She recently starred in Yasmina Reza's award winning *God of Carnage* at the prestigious Gate Theater in Dublin.

Prior to joining the cast of "ER," Tierney spent four years on the critically acclaimed NBC series "NewsRadio."

Born and raised in Boston, she currently divides her time between Los Angeles and New York.



AASIF MANDVI

Aasif Mandvi is a correspondent on Comedy Central's "The Daily Show with Jon Stewart." This past fall, Aasif starred in the critically acclaimed production of Ayad Akhtar's play *Disgraced* at Lincoln Center. His most recent work in film includes *The Internship* starring alongside Will Ferrell, Owen Wilson and Vince Vaughn—to be released summer, 2013.

Mandvi is the recipient of the 1999 OBIE award for his critically acclaimed play *Sakina's Restaurant*. Mandvi both performed and conceived his one-man show, which would become the inspiration for his feature film *Today's Special*—which he co-wrote and stars in.

Additional New York stage credits include the Broadway revival of *Oklahoma!* directed by Trevor Nunn, as well as *Homebody/Kabul* by Tony Kushner and *suburbia* by Eric Bogosian, and *Trudy Blue* by Marcia Norman.

Mandvi's film credits include M. Night Shyamalan's *The Last Airbender*, Merchant/Ivory's *The Mystic Masseur*, *The Proposal* with Sandra Bullock, *Ghost Town* with Ricky Gervais, *Music and Lyrics* with Hugh Grant and Drew Barrymore, *Spiderman 2*, *Freedomland*, *The Seige* and *Analyze This*. Additional feature film credits include *It's Kind of A Funny Story*, *Ruby Sparks*, *Premium Rush*, and *Margin Call*.

Notable television credits include "Curb Your Enthusiasm," "Sex and the City," "Sleeper Cell," "The Sopranos," "The Bedford Diaries," "Oz," "CSI," "Law & Order," and "Tanner on Tanner" directed by Robert Altman. He is also known for recurring roles on "Jericho" and "ER."

His critically acclaimed musical *Vices: A Love Story* was produced at the Caldwell Theatre where it was nominated for eight 2010 Carbonell Awards including Best New Work and Best Musical. *Vices: A Love Story,* the musical that *Variety* called "a minor miracle...a sensual celebration," has received multiple regional productions and will be produced in NYC, spring 2014. LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD



TODD HAIMES

Since 1983, Todd Haimes has transformed Roundabout Theatre Company from a small, Off-Broadway theatre into one of the leading cultural institutions in New York City. Mr. Haimes has been Artistic Director of the Roundabout Theatre Company since July 1, 1990. From 1983 to 1990, Mr. Haimes served as the theatre's Executive Director, overseeing the company's finances, marketing and fundraising. During the extraordinary years that followed, he also oversaw the biggest period of growth in the company's history.

Under Todd's leadership, Roundabout opened the doors of its first Broadway home at the Criterion Center with Harold Pinter's *The Homecoming* in October 1991. By 1993, Roundabout was enjoying tremendous artistic success with critically acclaimed productions, such as Friedrich Durrenmatt's *The Visit* and Eugene O'Neill's *Anna Christie*, gracing the Roundabout stage.

In 1994, Haimes jumped at the chance to transform the cabaret space next to its mainstage theatre into an intimate Off-Broadway theatre. With the extraordinary support of Laura Pels and Cory and Bob Donnalley, the new 399-seat Laura Pels Theatre opened in 1995 with Jason Robards in Harold Pinter's *Moonlight*. In 2002, Haimes search for a permanent home for the Laura Pels Theatre came to an end with the signing of a long-term lease on the former American Place Theatre. After an extensive renovation, the new Laura Pels Theatre opened with Lynne Nottage's *Intimate Apparel*. In 2005, Roundabout completed a new Black Box Theatre for readings, workshops, and eventually the acclaimed Roundabout Underground program.

Haimes embarked Roundabout on a \$24 million capital campaign to renovate Broadway's Selwyn into the renamed and restored American Airlines Theatre, which held its inaugural production, Kaufman and Hart's *The Man Who Came To Dinner* starring Nathan Lane in 2000. In 2003, Roundabout moved forward with negotiations to purchase Studio 54, the funky, unique theatre which was featuring their award-winning production of *Cabaret*. Haimes closed on the property on July 23, 2003. After *Cabaret* completed its six year, critically acclaimed run, the musical *Assassins* became the first production in the space under Roundabout's ownership. The production, directed by Joe Mantello, won five Tony® Awards that year. In 2009, Roundabout opened the newly restored, LEED certified, Henry Miller's Theatre, renamed The Stephen Sondheim Theatre in 2010—home of Roundabout's Tony Award Winning production of *Anything Goes*.

As Haimes leads Roundabout into its 48th season, which features *Bad Jews, The Real Thing,* and *Dinner with Friends*, the company has settled into five permanent homes and continues its acclaimed artistic legacy.

Mr. Haimes has a Bachelors Degree from the University of Pennsylvania and a Masters Degree in Business Administration from the Yale School of Organization and Management.

PETER DUCHAN wrote the book of the musical *Dogfight* (Second Stage, directed by Joe Mantello). For *Dogfight*, he and collaborators Benj Pasek & Justin Paul received the 2011 Richard Rodgers Award from the American Academy of Arts & Letters. Peter co-wrote the screenplay for *Breaking Upwards* (IFC Films), and the short film *Unlocked* (Official Selection of the Tribeca Film Festival, Gijon International Film Festival).
