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MEGAN MULLALLY



Megan currently appears as Chief on the Emmy award-winning comedy *Childrens Hospital*. Other recent television includes *Party Down, Parks and Recreation, Bob's Burgers, Web Therapy, Trophy Wife, Axe Cop, 30 Rock, Happy Endings*, and *Up All Night*.

Recent film work includes *Smashed*, *Kings of Summer*, *Ernest & Celestine*, *GBF*, *Somebody Up There Likes Me*, and the upcoming *Trouble Dolls* and *Alexander and the Terrible*, *Horrible*, *No-Good Very Bad Day*.

In addition to many Los Angeles- and Chicago-based theatrical productions, Megan has appeared on Broadway in *How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying, Grease*, and *Young Frankenstein*. In April, Megan played Adelaide opposite Nathan Lane at Carnegie Hall, and can currently be seen Off-Broadway in Sharr White's two-person play *Annapurna*, alongside Mr. Offerman.

Nick Offerman is best known for the role of Ron Swanson on NBC's hit comedy series *Parks and Recreation*, in which he stars with Amy Poehler. In addition to his current series, television audiences have seen Offerman on multiple episodes of Adult Swim's *Childrens Hospital* and ABC's *George Lopez*. He has also guest starred on numerous series, including *CSI: NY, Gilmore Girls, Monk, Deadwood, NYPD Blue, 24, The Practice, Will & Grace, The West Wing* and *ER*.

On the big screen, Offerman was last seen in Warner Bros.' box office successes *The LEGO Movie* and *We're The Millers*, with Jennifer Aniston and Jason Sudeikis. He also recently appeared in *The Kings of Summer* and *In A World*, Lake Bell's Sundance hit. Offerman produced and starred in *Somebody Up There Likes Me*. Further film credits include *21 Jump Street*, with Channing Tatum and Jonah Hill; *Smashed*, with Octavia Spencer and Megan Mullally; *Casa de mi Padre* with Will Ferrell, Gael García Bernal and Diego Luna; *All Good Things*; *The Men Who Stare at Goats*, alongside George Clooney and Jeff Bridges; *Harmony and Me*; *RSO [Registered Sex Offender]*; *The Go-Getter*; *Wristcutters: A Love Story*; and *Sin City*.

Offerman got his start in the Chicago theater community, where he was a founding member of the Defiant Theatre. He received a Joseph Jefferson Citation for his performance in *The Kentucky Cycle*, at Chicago's Pegasus Players Theatre, and was awarded a second Jefferson Nod for the puppets and masks he crafted for *The Skriker*, at the Defiant. He also worked extensively at Steppenwolf, The Goodman, Wisdom Bridge and Pegasus Players, among others. His stage work includes the Off-Broadway musical *Adding Machine*, and he is a company member of the Evidence Room Theater Company in Los Angeles.

As an author, Offerman released his first book, *Paddle Your Own Canoe: One Man's Fundamentals for Delicious Living*, which was published by Dutton.

He is also the director and co-writer of *VICES* (Jefferson Award nominated direction). Michael is one of the songwriters of "Throw That Girl Around" from the Broadway musical *Swing!* His musical *Bingo (The Winning Musical)* had a successful Off-Broadway run and continues to have numerous productions nationally and internationally. A 2009 Dramatist Guild Fellow, he and longtime writing partner Ilene Reid-www.heitzmanreid.com - recently completed a two-year residency at Indiana University where they developed their new musical, *Solana*. Their web-series *Going Up - The Songs of Heitzman & Reid* features Broadway singers interpreting their music and can be seen at http://www.youtube.com/heitzmanreid. In addition to having several TV and film scripts in development, he and Ms. Reid wrote for the NBC series *Just Deal* and their sitcom *Scott Free*, developed with Barbra Streisand's production company Barwood Films and Kelsey Grammer's production company Grammnet, was purchased by Paramount Pictures. Michael Heitzman is a member of The Dramatists Guild, BMI, and the WGA East.

MICHAEL MANCINI (Musical Director) Somewhere in the Mancini Family archives there's a video of a toddler Michael playing an LP record over and over again. Cut to the present, and it's that same fascination and focus on discovering the essence of a piece of music that distinguishes his talent, and underscores his successful career in musical performance and production.

Mancini's piano playing has been featured on Albums, on Television, and in short films, and he has had the good fortune of performing with many of the very artists who have influenced his own music, most notably Stevie Wonder, Bruce Springsteen, Jon Bon Jovi, Phoebe Snow, Felix Cavaliere, Eric Clapton, Jose Feliciano, B.B.King and Sheryl Crow. Michael has also worked with jazz and cabaret performers in New York City, and had done shows at 54 Below, Feinsteins Regency, Jazz at Lincoln Center, and the Cutting Room. He has been musical director and keyboardist for the NJ Hall of Fame Awards at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center.

With the his production company Mancini Productions Inc., Michael has been composing and producing music for TV Commercials as well as working with established, and up and coming artists. Working with corporate event producers, he has composed and produced music and directed orchestras for Boeing, AMC Networks, Washington Mutual Bank, Wal-Mart, Computer Associates, T-Mobile, Pfizer, Bristol Myers-Squibb and Dish Network.

Michael is currently part of the Hackley School Performing Arts Program in Tarrytown NY. His focus is instructing students in piano, songwriting and music technology.

MARCUS BELLAMY (Choreographer) is originally from Florida and studied dance at the Florida Dance Workshop, followed by Interlochen Arts Academy and The Juilliard School. Marcus has worked with choreographers Josh Bergasse, John Scott, Brian Brooks, Cherice Barton, Chase Brock, Sean Curran, AC Ciulla, Sharon Randolph, Donald Byrd, Meryl Tankard, Joey McKneely, Tyler Gilstrap and Daniel Ezralow, to mention a few. Bellamy has toured Italy, Lebanon and Japan with West Side Story and worked with Julie Taymor on her Beatles film Across the Universe. Marcus danced in the NBC television show Smash as a recurring Hit List cast member and was in the original Broadway cast of Tarzan and Spiderman: Turn off the Dark. Recent projects include A Midsummer Night's Dream with Julie Taymor, The Human Slug at the (un) Fair Art Fair and touring Ireland with John Scott's company Irish Modern Dance Theatre! ROBYN GOODMAN

Robyn Goodman began her career as an actress working mostly for the great Joseph Papp who eventually encouraged her to be a Producer. Heeding that sage advice, in 1980 Ms. Goodman co-founded Second Stage Theatre with Carole Rothman and was Co-Artistic Director for the first 13 years producing 50 plays and musicals.

In 2000 she founded Aged In Wood Productions and is perhaps best known for developing and producing the musical *Avenue Q*, which went on to win the Tony® Award for Best Musical in 2004. She then produced *In the Heights*, which premiered Off-Broadway and then moved to Broadway. It went on to win the Tony® Award for Best Musical in 2008. She is currently producing the Tony® Award winning Broadway production of Rodgers + Hammerstein's *Cinderella*.

Robyn's other Broadway credits include Steel Magnolias, Barefoot in the Park, The Performers, Bengal Tiger in the Baghdad Zoo starring Robin Williams, West Side Story (recent revival), American Idiot, Metamorphoses (Drama Desk Award), A Class Act (Tony® nomination) and High Fidelity. Off-Broadway she produced Bat Boy, tick, tick...Boom!, Our Lady of 121st Street, Red Light Winter and the award winning Christian boy band homage, Altar Boyz.

She spent 4 years as the Supervising Producer of ABC's *One Life To Live*, which garnered 6 Emmys for it's ground breaking "gay" story starring Ryan Phillippe.

Robyn is currently the Artistic Consultant to the Roundabout Theatre Company, where she serves as Artistic Producer of the Underground Series. This year marks their eighth successful season where such plays as *Speech and Debate* by Stephen Karam and *Bad Jews* by Joshua Harmon were launched.

This January she and Alexander Fraser assumed leadership of the Bucks County Playhouse in New Hope, Pennsylvania. They are programming the 75th anniversary season of this historic playhouse that is set to launch this month.

Richard Nelson's plays include a four-play series for The Public Theater called *The Apple Family (Regular Singing*, Sorry, Sweet and Sad, and That Hopey Changey Thing), Farewell to the Theatre [Hampstead Theatre], Nikolai and the Others [Lincoln Center Theater], Conversations in Tusculum [Public], How Shakespeare Won the West [Huntington], Frank's Home [Goodman, Playwrights Horizons], Rodney's Wife [Playwrights], Franny's Way [Playwrights], Madame Melville [West End, Off-Broadway], Goodnight Children Everywhere [Royal Shakespeare Company, Playwrights], The General From America [RSC, Theatre for a New Audience], New England [RSC, Manhattan Theatre Club], Misha's Party (with Alexander Gelman) [RSC, Moscow Art Theatre, Williamstown Festival], Columbus and the Discovery of Japan [RSC], Two Shakespearean Actors [RSC, Lincoln Center Theater], Some Americans Abroad [RSC, LCT], Left [New York Stage & Film], Life Sentences [Second Stage], and Principia Scriptoriae [MTC, RSC]. He has written the musicals Unfinished Piece for a Player Piano (with Peter Golub), James Joyce's The Dead (with Shaun Davey), and My Life With Albertine (with Ricky Ian Gordon); the screenplays for the films Hyde Park-on-Hudson (Roger Michell, director), Ethan Frome (John Madden, director), and Sensibility and Sense (David Jones, director). He has written numerous translations/adaptations as well as co-translating a series of Russian classical plays with the eminent translators, Richard Pevear and Larissa Volokhonsky. So far, they have translated Chekhov's *The Cherry* Orchard, Turgenev's A Month in the Country and Gogol's The Inspector. He has directed his plays on Broadway, Off-Broadway, at major regional theaters, on London's West End, and at the RSC and the National

Nelson has received numerous awards both in America and abroad, including a Tony® Award (Best Book of a Musical for *James Joyce's The Dead*), an Olivier Award (Best Play for *Goodnight Children Everywhere*), Tony® nominations (Best Play for *Two Shakespearean Actors*; Best Score as co-lyricist for *James Joyce's The Dead*), a second Olivier nomination (Best Comedy for *Some Americans Abroad*), two OBIEs, a Lortel Award (*James Joyce's The Dead*), a New York Drama Critics' Circle Award, a Guggenheim Fellowship, a Lila Wallace-Reader's Digest Writers' Award. He is the recipient of the PEN/Laura Pels Foundation Award for Drama, an Academy Award from the American Academy of Arts and Letters, and he is an Honorary Associate Artist of the Royal Shakespeare Company. He lives in Rhinebeck, New York.

Other awards include three Academy Awards and eight Grammys, including the 2008 Lifetime Achievement Award and 1997 Trustees Award, and he was inducted into the Songwriters Hall of Fame. Bacharach's memoir, *Anyone Who Had a Heart*, was published in May 2013.

HAL DAVID was the recipient of an Academy Award for "Raindrops Keep Falling on My Head," more than 30 gold records, a Grammy, the NARM Presidential Award, the Grammy Trustees Award from NARAS as well as their New York Heroes Award and the British Ivor Novello Award. 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

BERTOLT BRECHT was one of the most influential playwrights of the 20th century. His works include *The Threepenny Opera* (1928) with composer Kurt Weill, *Mother Courage and Her Children* (1941), *The Good Person of Szechwan* (1943), and *The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui* (1958). Brecht was born in Augsburg, Bavaria, in 1898, and the two world wars directly affected his life and works. He wrote poetry when he was a student but studied medicine at the Ludwig Maximilian University of Munich. After military service during World War I, he abandoned his medical studies to pursue writing and the theater.

JOHN WILLETT was a British translator and a scholar who studied music and stage design at the Manchester College of Art and Dance. Willett began his career as a theatre designer, but became a freelance writer, an editor and translator, a theater director, and a visiting professor and lecturer after serving in WWII. He was respected in academic circles for his patient work and careful research in translation, especially in German culture and politics. Willett worked on English translations for many of Brecht's plays, including: *Life of Galileo, Good Person of Szechwan, The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui*, and *Mother Courage and Her Children*.









London Wall

Mint Theater Company, Producer Written by John van Druten

Best known today for his Broadway hits as Old Acquaintance, The Voice of the Turtle, I Remember Mama, Bell, Book and Candle, and I Am a Camera (which inspired the classic Broadway musical Cabaret), John Van Druten wrote deftly observed, character-driven plays that ranged from the realistic atmosphere of his early West End plays, to the sentimental charm of his wartime hits, to the daring allurements of his final works. In his early West End plays, Van Druten became noted for his sensitive portrayals of young romantics and would-be bohemians, as well as for the "truthful naturalism" of his settings. Van Druten's most successful plays during this era include the domestic drama After All (1931), London Wall (1931), for which Van Druten drew upon his personal experience working in a legal office, and the romantic comedy There's Always Juliet (1932). Van Druten enjoyed a transatlantic success that carried him to Hollywood, where he co-wrote such classics as Gaslight, and also contributed (uncredited) to the screenplay of Gone with the Wind. Van Druten enjoyed phenomenal Broadway success in the WWII era, with a string of critically acclaimed hits. After the effervescent Old Acquaintance (1940), Van Druten wrote the three-character romantic comedy The Voice of the Turtle (1943), which ran for a stunning 1,557 performances. The nostalgic I Remember Mama, based on Kathryn Forbes' novel Mama's Bank Account, similarly moved wartime audiences as an impressionistic "family album." Van Druten's hits continued with Bell, Book and Candle (1950), about a seductive witch secretly practicing sorcery in modern Manhattan. 1951's I Am a Camera, adapted from his close friend Christoper Isherwood's Berlin Stories, provided an iconic role for Julie Harris as the decadent Weimar party girl Sally Bowles. Appreciated in his own lifetime for his "amusing, touching plays, written lightly and expertly, and with beguiling style" (as described by The New York Times' Brooks Atkinson), Van Druten is in the midst of an exciting resurgence sure to stir vivid theatrical memories, as well as to

enchant new generations of theater-goers.






