In 2017, Mike was honored with the Kurt Vonnegut Award for humor.



# **TERRY BYRNE**


Terry Byrne has been the General Manager of Off-Broadway's Westside Theatre for twenty-eight years, through the course of more than sixty productions, including the historic 12-year run of *I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change*, and the seminal three-year run of *The Vagina Monologues*. Ms. Byrne was Associate Producer of the NY productions of *Trumbo*, *Hedwig and the Angry Inch*, and *Political Animal*. Her Off-Broadway experience began in 1984, first as a box office treasurer, at the Theatre at St. Peter's, the Sullivan Street Playhouse, the Village Gate, and the Provincetown Playhouse, and later as a company manager (including three seasons at the Mirror Repertory Theatre, *Vampire Lesbians of Sodom, Psycho Beach Party, The Kathy & Mo Show, The Road to Mecca, Closer Than Ever*, among others).

Ms. Byrne has served on the Board of Directors of the League of Off-Broadway Theatres and Producers since 1993. In past years she has been elected as an officer, and she is currently the first female President in the League's 60-year history. Over the decades, her work with the League has included service on all negotiating committees for the League's collectively bargained agreements with AEA, SDC, and USA. She has also served on the Administration and Host Committees for the Lucille Lortel Awards, on the League's By-Laws Committee, and on the Marketing Committee. She is a Green Captain for the Westside Theatre, and has served on the Off-Broadway chapter of the Broadway Green Alliance.

Other volunteer activity includes service to the Unitarian Universalist Congregation at Montclair, where she was a member of the Board of Trustees, was Co-chair of the Religious Education program for Children and Youth, has served as lead teacher in that program, and continues to serve as a classroom instructor. Along with her husband, she was a Co-Producer of the annual Holiday Pageant for many years.

Ms. Byrne was an Advisory Board Member for the Charles Seller Foundation/Talent Time Players, a not-for-profit theatre company in New Jersey that donates the proceeds from its annual production to a local child with high medical expenses. She has also served that organization as Producer and as volunteer in the front of house for their annual production. For the Music Parents Association of Bloomfield High School, she served as an officer for many years, as well as Fundraising Chair, and Chair of the annual Music Honors Banquet.

# MARÍA IRENE FORNÉS

Visionary Cuban-American playwright and director María Irene Fornés constructed astonishing worlds onstage, continually challenging and broadening our perception of what theater could be. She wrote over 40 plays, won nine OBIE Awards, and mentored thousands of playwrights across the globe. Off-Broadway's Signature Theatre devoted its entire 1999-2000 season to her work, and her epic *What of the Night?* was a finalist for the 1990 Pulitzer Prize. Theater luminaries like Tony Kushner, Caryl Churchill, Paula Vogel, Lanford Wilson, and Edward Albee have credited Fornes as an inspiration and influence. "Her work has no precedents; it isn't derived from anything," Lanford Wilson once said of Fornes. "She's the most original of us all." Paula Vogel contends: "In the work of every American playwright at the end of the 20th century, there are only two stages: before she has read María Irene Fornés and after."

But Fornés did not set out to become a playwright. After arriving in New York City from Cuba in 1945, she worked mostly in textiles and even traveled as a painter to Paris in the 1950s. Not until the 1960s did Fornes write what she considered to be her first real play—*Tango Palace*—which catapulted her into the vanguard of the nascent Off-Off Broadway theater movement and a downtown DIY aesthetic that continues to thrive today. Often referred to as the American theater's "Mother Avant-Garde," Fornés steadfastly refused to adhere to any rules or formulas in playwriting, choosing instead to follow her characters' lead in order to better get at her core question: What does it mean to be a human being? As a teacher and director of the INTAR Hispanic Playwrights in Residence Lab in the 1980s, she mentored a generation of Latinx playwrights, including Cherríe Moraga, Migdalia Cruz, Nilo Cruz, Caridad Svich, and Eduardo Machado. In 2005, while presenting Fornés with the Theater Practitioner Award at TCG's conference in Seattle, Machado said: "She told us that we were going to change the theater, that we were going to create a world where Latino writers in America had a voice, and she willed it into all of us. And none of us would be here without her. She is the architect of how we create theater, how we teach, and the way we lead our lives."

Fornés died on October 30, 2018, at the age of 88, in Manhattan.







OSCAR HAMMERSTEIN II (1895-1960) began his stage career as a playwright, soon turning to librettos and lyrics written for some of the greatest composers of his day. His innovations breathed new life into the art form of operetta. He wrote eight musicals with Jerome Kern, including their masterpiece, *Show Boat*. His last musical before embarking on an exclusive partnership with Richard Rodgers was *Carmen Jones*, his retelling of Bizet's tragic opera for an all-black cast. Their first collaboration, *Oklahoma!*, was the first of a new genre—the musical play. Over the next 17 years, Rodgers and Hammerstein wrote eight more Broadway musicals—*Carousel, Allegro, South Pacific, The King and I, Me and Juliet, Pipe Dream, Flower Drum Song*, and *The Sound of Music*; one movie musical, *State Fair*; and one for TV, "Cinderella." In 1952, he published *LYRICS*, a collection of his own lyrics with a classic introduction "Notes on Lyrics."

**JOSEPH STEIN**'s (1912-2010) first work for the theatre was as co-author of *Plain and Fancy*. Additional theatre credits include: *Mr. Wonderful*, starring Sammy Davis, Jr.; the libretto for the Bock and Harnick musical *The Body Beautiful*; *Take Me Along*; *Ah, Wilderness*; *Juno*, with score by Marc Blitzstein; the adaptation for *Enter Laughing*, *Fiddler on the Roof* (Tony® and Drama Critics' Circle Award); *Zorba* (Tony® nomination), *King of Hearts*, *Irene*, *Rags* (Tony nomination), and *The Baker's Wife* (Olivier nomination). Mr. Stein also authored the screenplays for *Enter Laughing* and *Fiddler on the Roof*.

**JERRY BOCK**'s (1928-2010) credits include: *The Body Beautiful, Fiorello!* (Tony®, New York Critics' Circle Award, Pulitzer Prize), *Tenderloin, She Loves Me, Fiddler on the Roof* (nine Tonys®), *The Apple Tree*, and *The Rothschilds*. Bock and Sheldon Harnick were inducted into the Theater Hall of Fame, received the Johnny Mercer Award from the Songwriters Hall of Fame, and the received the Spirit of American Creativity Award from the Foundation for a Creative America. Bock also received an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree from the University of Wisconsin, the school where he met his wife Patti and where he decided to be a composer. As for Patti, his wife, George, their son, and Portia, their daughter, Bock confessed they were his longest running hit.

SHELDON HARNICK's career began in the 1950s with songs in revues both on Broadway and Off-Broadway (e.g. *The Boston Beguine, The Merry Little Minuet*). With Jerry Bock he created *Fiorello!* (Tony® Award, Pulitzer Prize), *Tenderloin, The Apple Tree, She Loves Me* (Grammy), and *Fiddler on the Roof* (Tony®). Other collaborations: *Rex* (Richard Rodgers), *A Christmas Carol* (Michael Legrand), *A Wonderful Life* (Joe Raposo), *The Phantom Tollbooth* (Arnold Black), and *The Audition* (Marvin Hamlisch). He has written two musicals himself: *Dragons* and *A Doctor in Spite of Himself*. Recently: *Rothschild and Sons* (a re-conceived version of *The Rothschilds*). Mr. Harnick is a member of The Dramatists Guild and the Songwriters Guild.

**SHRAGA FRIEDMAN** (1924-1970) was an actor, writer, translator, director, and star of a variety of radio programs. Shraga was accepted to the first class of the dramatic school of Habimah National Theater where he met his wife, Shoshana Ravid. During Israel's War of Independence, Shraga created a military entertainment troupe, of which he was the artistic director. Shraga served as assistant to directors of renown like Harold Clurman, Leopold Lindberg, and Lee Strasberg, leading him to co-direct musicals like *My Fair Lady* and *Fiddler on the Roof*, and direct Yiddish shows and original Hebrew plays. Well-versed in both Hebrew, Yiddish, and English, Shraga translated shows from English into Hebrew, English into Yiddish, and Yiddish into Hebrew.

#### Happy Birthday, Wanda June

KURT VONNEGUT, JR. is considered one of the most influential American novelists of the 20th Century and is best known for the novels *Cat's Cradle*, *Slaughterhouse-Five* and *Breakfast of Champions*. Vonnegut's first play, *Happy Birthday, Wanda June*, had him named Most Promising Playwright. When asked about the origin of the idea for Wanda June, Vonnegut has written: "I once led a Great Books Study Group on Cape Cod and we read and discussed Homer's *Odyssey*. I found the behavior of Odysseus after arriving home unexpectedly from the Trojan War hilariously pig-headed and somehow Hemingway-esque. And then I remembered the blowhard father of a girl I dated in high school, who had heard of huge rubies to be found in the Amazon Rain Forest, and wanted to quit his job and go look for them. The rest is history."

#### The Shadow of a Gunman

Produced by Irish Repertory Theatre Written by Sean O'Casey

SEAN O'CASEY (1880-1964) is an Irish dramatist renowned for his innovative playwriting style, which balances deeply comic and tragic elements in an atmosphere of stark realism, with emphasis on characterization of working and lower class Dubliners. O'Casey began to write plays in 1916. His first four submissions to The Abbey Theatre were rejected, but O'Casey persisted, and in 1923, The Abbey produced *The Shadow of a Gunman*, beginning O'Casey's career as a playwright at age 43. *Juno and the Paycock* (1924) and *The Plough and the Stars* (1926) completed O'Casey's famed Dublin Trilogy, and established his career as a full-time writer. In 1926, he met Eileen Carey, an actress in the West End production of *The Plough and the Stars*, and they married in 1927. Together they had three children, Breon, Niall, and Shivaun. O'Casey died of a heart attack on September 18, 1964, at the age of 84.
