A true quadruple threat, Jared is an actor, singer, dancer, and choreographer of stage and screen. Michael Mancini (Musical Director)

Michael Mancini is a New York-based pianist, multi keyboard player, arranger, conductor and composer. He has performed with musical icons Bruce Springsteen, Eric Clapton, Stevie Wonder, BB King, Jon Bon Jovi, Darlene Love, and more. Conductor and musical director credits include: the Lucille Lortel Awards, *The Twelve* (Denver Center), and the New Jersey Hall Of Fame Awards (NJPAC). He has conducted orchestras at Lincoln Center Geffen Hall, The Beacon Theatre, and the Schermerhorn Center with the Nashville Symphony. Michael works with his jazz trio in the New York metropolitan area, and as an arranger and pianist with cabaret acts and rock/folk singer-songwriters at The Bitter End, The Cutting Room, The Lucille Lortel Theater, and 54 Below, among others. He is also an educator at The Hackley School in Tarrytown, NY.



Jessy Yates (Award Statue Presenter)

Jessy Yates is an MFA Acting candidate at David Geffen School of Drama at Yale, where she is the first wheelchair-using student in attendance. She has performed at venues such as The Public Theatre, BAM, The Kennedy Center, Williamstown Theatre Festival, Ars Nova, and guest stared on ABC's "Speechless" and "Law & Order: SVU." Her show original work, *You're Going to Hell if You Laugh*, has been seen at Prelude Festival 2017, BAM, and Dixon Place. She is an alumnus of NYU Tisch (PHTS). In 2018 she was awarded a full scholarship to Yale as a part of The Ruderman Foundation's scholarship to promote disabled artistry in high education.

Yuliya Basis (Performer)

A Moscow Tchaikovsky Conservatory graduate, Yuliya Basis performs as a collaborative pianist at numerous New York City venues, as well as abroad, and serves on the piano faculty at the United Nations International School and the British International School. Yuliya and her husband, Andy Didorenko, formed their violin and piano duo in 2002. Together, the team has appeared in recitals in the US, Taiwan, Russia, and Ukraine, and released two albums, *Go 4 Sonatas* (2008) and *Intervals* (2013), featuring Andy's classical works. Yuliya also toured with Lost World Band, the rock fusion ensemble, as a keyboard player and backing vocalist.



Bobby Daye (Performer)

Bobby Daye's career has crossed into stage, film, TV and radio. As a songwriter, he's done the music and lyrics to the new musical LOVE AND SOUTHERN D!SCOMFORT, with book by Monica L. Patton. He's also proud of his work with Just One Step For Democracy, an organization founded Arnetia Walker and Stephen Nachamie to promote voting through the arts. Hear his song For America, as well as This Voice which was co-written by Sylvia McCalla and Yvette Cason. He also writes for "The Young and The Restless" with writing partner Tom Kochan, and he penned the theme song to the ABC-TV soap Loving, which was performed by Johnny Mathis. His Broadway credits include Moulin Rouge, Aladdin, After Midnight, Book of Mormon, Shrek, The Color Purple, The Lion King, Smokey Joe's Cafe, Dreamgirls and The Wiz.



Andy Didorenko (Performer)

A virtuoso violinist and composer, Andy Didorenko was born in Dnipro, Ukraine. He took first lessons with his parents and made an orchestra debut at the age of 10. He graduated from Moscow Tchaikovsky Conservatory and appeared as a soloist with Moscow Symphony and Moscow Camerata. From 1999 to 2004, Andy lived in Taiwan where he taught, performed, and debuted as a composer. In New York, Andy has become a sought-after performer and educator. Among his compositions are virtuoso violin solos, a double concerto, chamber works, student pieces. His rock fusion ensemble, Lost World Band, has released several critically acclaimed albums.



Marcy Harriell (Performer)

Marcy Harriell likes to change her roles like she changes her clothing. Luckily, she knows how to sew. Between Broadway-belting in *Rent*, *In The Heights* and *Lennon*; Off-Broadway soprano and dramatic turns at City Center Encores! and Second Stage; in studio for Disney's *Moana* and duo collaborations with the jazz great Ethan Iverson; or starring on big and small screens in *Men In Black*, *Search Party*, and *Manifest*, she plays in every costume shop available. Adding editor, sound engineer, and best boy to her resume, Marcy frolics alongside her husband Rob in their popular YouTube series *The Handmade Harriells*, in which they take audiences on a joyful ride into their technicolor lives. In fact, she'll be wearing one of her handmade gowns onstage tonight. Throughout her career, Marcy has had the honor to work with and learn from numerous legends in the industry—the great Stephen Sondheim guided her performance of Marta in *Company* at both Lincoln Center and the Kennedy Center.

She has worked on all of the Chekhov plays at Lake Lucille with Brian Mertes and Melissa Kievman, spent many summers in the 80s at River Arts Repertory in Woodstock, New York, and many seasons at Los Angeles Theatre Center. She is a member of LAByrinth Theater Company, is a New York Theatre Workshop Usual Suspect, and a member of The Commissary. Recent films include *Diane*, *Lez Bomb*, *I Am a Seagull*, *The Boy Downstairs*, *Gabriel*, *Synecdoche*, *New York*, and *Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind*. TV includes roles on the upcoming "Outer Range" and "Big Door Prize," as well as "One Dollar," "The Path," "The Affair," and "Nurse Jackie." She has an Obie for Sustained Excellence in Performance and a Lilly Award for Distinguished Service to Playwrights.

PLAYWRIGHTS' SIDEWALK INDUCTEE



DAVID HENRY HWANG

DAVID HENRY HWANG is best known as the author of *M. Butterfly*, which won the 1988 Tony[®], Drama Desk, John Gassner, and Outer Critics Circle Awards, and was a Finalist for the 1989 Pulitzer Prize. It ran on London's West End for a year and has been produced in over three dozen countries. A revival, directed by Julie Taymor, starring Clive Owen and Jin Ha, ran on Broadway in 2017.

Yellow Face, which premiered at Los Angeles' Mark Taper Forum and the Public Theater, received a 2008 Obie Award for playwriting and was a Finalist for the 2008 Pulitzer Prize; its London premiere at the Park Theatre transferred to the National Theatre. The New York *Times* has named *Yellow Face* one of the best American plays of the past 25 years. Golden Child also premiered at the Public, received a 1997 Obie Award, and moved to Broadway, where it received three 1998 Tony® Nominations, including Best New Play. Chinglish premiered at Chicago's Goodman Theatre before moving to Broadway, where it was named Best New American Play of 2011 by *Time* Magazine.


Other plays include *FOB* (1981 Obie Award), *The Dance and the Railroad* (1982 Drama Desk Nomination), and *Family Devotions* (1982 Drama Desk Nomination). From 2012-14 Hwang was a Residency One Playwright at New York's Signature Theatre, which premiered his play *Kung Fu*.

Hwang has written books for three Broadway musicals. His 2002 revision of Rodgers & Hammerstein's *Flower Drum Song* earned him his third Tony® nomination, for Best Book. He co-wrote Disney's international hit *Aida*, with music and lyrics by Elton John and Tim Rice, which won four 2000 Tony® Awards, as well as *Disney's Tarzan*, with songs by Phil Collins, whose European production ran for twelve years. *Aida* and *Tarzan* are both slated for upcoming revivals.

Called America's most-produced living opera librettist by *Opera News*, he has written thirteen libretti, including five works with composer Philip Glass, most recently *Circus Days and Nights* in 2021. He is a 2006 Grammy Award winner for *Ainadamar*, with music by Osvaldo Golijov, and has also written *Alice In Wonderland* with Unsuk Chin; *The Fly* with Howard Shore; two works with Bright Sheng (*The Silver River* and *Dream of the Red Chamber*); and three operas with Huang Ruo (*An American Soldier, The Rift*, and the upcoming *M. Butterfly*).

Hwang's screenplays include *M. Butterfly* and he is currently penning the live-action feature musical remake of Disney's *The Hunchback of Notre Dame* as well as an Anna May Wong biopic to star actress Gemma Chan. In television, he was a Writer/Consulting Producer for the Golden Globe-winning television series "The Affair" from 2015-2019 and is now creating two TV series, "Billion Dollar Whale" for Westward/SKG and another for Netflix. He also co-wrote the Gold Record "Solo" with the late pop music icon Prince.

Hwang is a Trustee of the American Theatre Wing, where he served as Chair. He also sits on the Council of the Dramatists Guild and is a professor at Columbia University School of the Arts. Recent honors include his 2021 election to the American Academy of Arts & Sciences and his 2018 induction into the Theatre Hall of Fame. Hwang's most recent musical, *Soft Power*, written with composer Jeanine Tesori, received four Lucille Lortel Award nominations, four Outer Critics Honors, a Grammy nomination for Best Musical Theatre Album, and was a Finalist for the 2020 Pulitzer Prize.



for feature film and are in preproduction to direct the feature doc on legendary rock engineer Eddie Kramer. Their first feature as writer/directors, *Almost Home*, was released in 2019. Jensen's acting credits include "For Life," "The Walking Dead," "Mindhunter," "Mr. Robot," Thurman Munson in "The Bronx is Burning," and over 70 more. Theater: Pulitzer Prize-winning *Disgraced* (LCT3), *The Good Negro* (The Public), *Corpus Christi* (MTC). Blank's film & TV acting credits include "High Maintenance," "Ramy," "Blue Bloods," and over 30 more. They are married and live in Brooklyn with their daughter Sadie.



RAJIV JOSEPH received the Lucille Lortel Award for Best Play in 2016 with Guards at the Taj (also a 2016 Obie Winner for Best Play).
