BEBE NEUWIRTH

An award winning actress of both stage and screen, Bebe Neuwirth is currently starring as Morticia Addams in *The Addams Family* on Broadway which opened in April 2010. She was the recipient of two Emmy Awards for her portrayal of the dry and straight-faced Dr. Lilith Sternin of "Cheers" and also received an Emmy nomination for her role of Dorothy Parker in the television movie "Dash and Lily." Bebe has also appeared on numerous other television series, including the new HBO hit "Bored to Death," "Wild Palms," and "Law & Order: Trial by Jury." On the big screen, Ms. Neuwirth has been seen in many blockbusters such as *Jumanji* and *Fame*, as well as films *Green Card*, *Summer of Sam*, *Celebrity*, *Liberty Heights*, and *Bugsy*, amongst others.

Bebe has shined on the stage in many Broadway hits. As a sizzling Velma in the 1996 smash-hit revival of *Chicago*, Bebe earned Tony and Drama Desk awards for Best Lead Actress in a Musical, as well as an Astaire Award, Outer Critics Circle Award, and the distinction of the Drama League Distinguished Performance of the Year. She also played Roxie in *Chicago*. Bebe won a Tony Award for Best Featured Actress in a Musical for her portrayal of Nickie in the 1986 revival of *Sweet Charity*, which was choreographed and directed by Bob Fosse. Bebe was a principal dancer in the 1999 Tony Award winning revue of the famed choreographer's work, *Fosse*. She has played the roles of Sheila in *A Chorus Line* and the sultry Lola in the 1994 Broadway hit *Damn Yankees*, as well as Monique in *Little Me* and a principal dancer in *Dancin'*.

With just as much success in Off-Broadway productions, Bebe has starred in many acclaimed Off-Broadway plays, including the 2003 Woody Allen comedy *Writer's Block* at the Atlantic Theater and Pulitzer Prize finalist Richard Greenberg's 2001 hit *Everett Beekin* at Lincoln Center Theater. Additionally, Bebe has been seen in *Here Lies Jenny* at the Zipper Theater and Roger Rosenblatt's *Ashley Montana Goes Ashore in the Caicos*. She also starred as Aurora/Spider Woman in London's West End production of *Kiss of the Spider Woman*. Other productions in regional theaters include her role as Cassie in *A Chorus Line*, Anita in *West Side Story*, and Katherine in *The Taming of the Shrew*.

Bebe Neuwirth has done voices for many cartoons, including *Another Goofy Movie*, the "Aladdin" series, *All Dogs Go to Heaven 2* and its subsequent series, and various PBS children's shows. She has also performed many hit concerts, including *Bebe Sings Weill and Kander & Ebb* and *Stories with Piano* and in revues such as *Upstairs at O'Neals'* and *Cabaret: Verboten*.

Other honors include the 2006 Rolex Dance Award, 2007 Dance Magazine Award, and being named an Honorary Ziegfeld Girl. Ms. Neuwirth founded The Dancers' Resource at The Actors Fund, a national human services organization for whom she is a Vice Chairman. She has also worked extensively with Dancers Responding to AIDS and Broadway Cares.



BRYAN BATT

Bryan Batt has won two Screen Actors Guild Awards and is a native New Orleanian actor, designer, fund-raiser, and civic activist in both New Orleans and New York. He plays Salvatore Romano on AMC's Emmy, Golden Globe, and Peabody Award-winning drama "Mad Men" and was recently featured as Spencer Cannon on the final episodes of "Ugly Betty."

His book, *She Ain't Heavy, She's My Mother: A Memoir* hits stores nation-wide on May 4, 2010. He will be performing, *Batt On a Hot Tin Roof* at Feinstein's at the Loews Regency in the Fall of 2010.

MICHAELHEITZMAN (Director) is one of the Grammy-nominated songwriters of "Throw That Girl Around" from the Broadway musical *Swing!* His first musical *Vices: A Love Story* just ended a critically acclaimed run at the Caldwell Theater in Boca Raton, FL where it was nominated for eight 2010 Carbonell Awards including Best New Work and Best Musical. His musical *Bingo* (the winning musical) had a successful Off-Broadway run and has had numerous productions nationally and internationally. It was honored with the 2007 Bay Area Critics Association Award for Best Musical. He and longtime writing partner Ilene Reid were selected for the 2008-2009 Dramatist Guild Fellowship. They are currently developing a new Broadway musical *Genius* based on the book by Patrick Dennis. He is also directing the world premier of Everett Bradley's new work *Evolution* slated for production in the Spring of 2011. In addition to having several TV and film scripts in development, he and Ms. Reid wrote for the NBC series "Just Deal" and their sitcom "Scott Free," developed with Barbra Streisand's production company Barwood Films and Kelsey Grammer's production company Grammnet, was purchased by Paramount Pictures. Michael Heitzman is a member of The Dramatists Guild, BMI and the Writer's Guild of America, East.

Future projects include the adaptation of the film Kinky Boots for a new Broadway musical.



LINCOLN CENTER THEATER

LINCOLN CENTER THEATER, under the direction of André Bishop, Artistic Director, and Bernard Gersten, Executive Producer, is one of New York's favorite not-for-profit theaters. Now celebrating its 25th year, it has produced over 130 productions at Lincoln Center's Vivian Beaumont and the Mitzi E. Newhouse Theaters, and at theaters on and Off-Broadway, as well as touring productions nationally and around the world, TV and film projects and original cast recordings. In the fall of 2008 LCT began a new programming initiative – LCT3 – devoted to producing the work of new playwrights, directors and designers. In addition LCT develops new work and encourages theater artists via play readings, workshops and an annual Directors Lab. Open Stages, LCT's education program, reaches thousands of New York City public school students. The theater is the publisher of the Lincoln Center Theater Review, which explores subjects related to its productions. This season LCT produced a slate of entirely new work. Fall and winter productions included Nathan Louis Jackson's Broke-Ology, directed by Thomas Kail, Sarah Ruhl's In the Next Room or The Vibrator Play, directed by Les Waters, Ann Marie Healy's What Once We Felt, directed by Ken Rus Schmoll and Andrew Bovell's When the Rain Stops Falling, directed by David Cromer. Upcoming are the world premiere of A.R. Gurney's *The Grand Manner* directed by Mark Lamos and the LCT3 productions of Graceland, a new play by Ellen Fairey, directed by Henry Wishcamper and On the Levee a play with music, conceived and directed by Lear deBessonet, play by Marcus Gardley and music and lyrics by Todd Almond. LCT's Tony Award winning production of Rodgers & Hammerstein's South Pacific, directed by Bartlett Sher, continues its record-breaking run in the Vivian Beaumont.



Bruce Norris' plays include: Clybourne Park (2010), The Infidel (2000), Purple Heart (2002), We All Went Down To Amsterdam (2003), The Pain And The Itch (2004) and The Unmentionables (2006) all of which premiered at Steppenwolf Theatre, Chicago. The Public Theater in association with McCarter Theatre, Producers Written by Tarell Alvin McCraney



Horton Foote's plays have been produced on Broadway, Off-Broadway, and in many regional theatres around the country. He received Academy Awards for his screenplay adaptation of *To Kill A Mockingbird* and his original screenplay, *Tender Mercies*. His play *The Young Man From Atlanta* received the Pulitzer Prize and a Tony nomination. Other awards include the Lucille Lortel, Outer Critics Circle, the Gold Medal of Drama from the American Academy of Arts and Letters, the PEN/Laura Pels Foundation Award for Drama, the New York State Governor's Arts Award, the National Medal of Arts Award from President Bill Clinton, the Drama Desk Lifetime Achievement Award, an OBIE Award, and a Tony nomination for *Dividing The Estate*.

BILLY ARONSON's plays have been produced by Ensemble Studio Theatre, Playwrights Horizons, and Woolly Mammoth, and published in 5 volumes of *Best American Short Plays*. His new play *First Day Of School* had simultaneous world premieres in Philadelphia and San Francisco, and has just been nominated for Best Original Script by the Bay Area Theatre Critics Circle. His writing for the musical theater includes the original concept/additional lyrics for *Rent*, and the book for the Theatreworks USA musical *Click, Clack, Moo*. TV writing credits include "Beavis & Butt-head," "Wonder Pets" (head writer first season), "Postcards From Buster" (Emmy nomination), and "Courage the Cowardly Dog." billyaronson.com

BRAD ALEXANDER wrote the music for Theatreworks USA's *Click, Clack, Moo* and *Just So Stories*, and songs for *Duck for President, If You Give a Pig a Pancake*, and *We the People*. Brad and collaborator Adam Mathias won the 2008 Richard Rodgers Award and 2007 Jerry Bock Award for their full-length musical *See Rock City & Other Destinations*, which premiered at Barrington Stage Company and will be produced Off-Broadway this summer by Transport Group Theatre Company. Brad is a member of The BMI Workshop, National Academy of Popular Music, and National Alliance for Musical Theatre. bradalexander.com

KEVIN DEL AGUILA is the bookwriter of *Altar Boyz* (NY Outer Critics Circle Award, Lortel and Drama Desk nominations). He received the Heideman Award for his play *The Greekest of Tragedies* (Actors Theatre of Louisville) and took top prize at the NY Fringe Festival with his comedy *6 Story Building*. Other works as a writer/lyricist include Nickelodeon's *Storytime Live*, adaptations of the children's books *Lilly's Big Day, I Have to Go* and *Duck for President* for Theatreworks USA, and his upcoming middle-aged superhero musical *The Astonishing Return of the Protagonists!*



Their collaboration also transferred itself to movies and television as they wrote original material for the Academy Awards, "Liza with a Z" (Emmy Award for Music and Lyrics), Funny Lady (Oscar nominated for Best Song), Lucky Lady, New York, New York, Stepping Out and Chicago (Oscar nominated for Best Song). In the mid-1980's the song "New York, New York" became the official anthem of New York City. At the time of the unfortunate death of Mr. Ebb, Kander and Ebb had several projects in different stages of completion waiting in the wings including The Visit, All About Us (a musical adaptation of Thornton Wilder play The Skin Of Our Teeth), Curtains and The Scottsboro Boys.

LORTEL AWARDS ARCHIVAL EXHIBITION

New York City is a world capital of the performing arts, with theatre, dance, opera, performance art, burlesque, circuses, and other popular entertainments happening every day in venues large and small, from Broadway houses to living rooms, throughout the city. These cultural events make up the fabric of New York City. But the history of performance is constantly in danger of being lost.

Performing arts archives and libraries maintain this rich history by preserving and making accessible original source materials associated with performance: scripts, sketches, models, costumes, props, set pieces, posters, playbills, photographs, papers, and other documents. Much of this material is lost or in private hands; it is a challenge to find and preserve materials for future research.

Several major theatre archives document the history of performance in the United States. The Billy Rose Collection of the New York Public Library for the Performing Arts is one of the largest and most comprehensive archives; the Harvard Theatre collection, founded in 1901, was the first collection of its kind to be established in the U.S., and is international in scope; and the Ransom Center for the Performing Arts, at the University of Texas at Austin, contains the papers of Stella Adler, the legendary acting teacher, among other unique source material.

In New York City, major performing arts venues—Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, New York Philharmonic, and the Brooklyn Academy of Music—have their own institutional archives, documenting the history of their organizations. But the scope of these important archives collections is limited and individual Broadway and Off-Broadway venues often do not have the means to preserve their own production histories.

Off-Broadway has a unique and rich history that is often overshadowed by its Broadway counterpart. The Off-Broadway League/Lortel Awards have been celebrating the achievements of Off-Broadway productions for 25 years. To honor this milestone, the Off-Broadway League and the Lucille Lortel Foundation have put together an intimate salon-style exhibit at Terminal 5 to showcase past winning companies and their productions. Showcasing a selection of posters, photographs, costumes, and other ephemera, we hope to draw attention to the significance of, and need for preserving materials designed and created for the Off-Broadway theatres. These materials enhance our understanding of Off-Broadway's incredible contribution to New York's ever-growing theatre history.

The Lortel Archives provides a catalogue of shows produced Off-Broadway with its Internet Off-Broadway Database (www.IOBDB.com). Working from the present backwards, the IOBDB includes complete Off-Broadway seasons dating back to 1958. More shows are added daily as our research continues.

ABOUT THE ARCHIVISTS

RYAN ANTHONY DONALDSON is currently the Archivist with The Durst Organization, a fourth-generation family real estate firm. Before living in New York City, Ryan earned an M.A. in History Museum Studies from the Cooperstown Graduate Program.

TIFFANY NIXON is the Archivist for Roundabout Theatre Company. Previous projects include the Library for the Performing Arts (NYPL), The Kitchen, Brooklyn Museum of Art, the Ford Foundation, and the Pacific Film Archive. Tiffany holds an M.L.I.S. (archives focus) and an M.A. in English Literature/Creative Writing.

JUNE REICH currently works for two fabulous non-profit arts organizations: the Brooklyn Academy of Music, where she is managing the archives' digitization project, and Sesame Workshop, where she recently curated the Sesame Street 40th anniversary exhibition at the Brooklyn Public Library (the exhibit is going on the road: next stop Los Angeles Public Library this fall). June has a MLS with a concentration in archives, and masters degrees in Performance Studies and English.
